The cherry basket pattern is excellent for a patchwork pillow as well as for colonial quilts. The following colors are suggested for it—brown printed material for the basket and handle, red print for the "cherries" (the red triangles which alternate with the brown triangles in the basket) and unbleached muslin for the background. One block is twelve inches square when completed. Patterns for all parts are given here except for the large triangle for the top half of the square upon which the handle is applied. This triangle is easily made, for it measures exactly

ten inches on the two sides. To make a pattern for it, fold a piece of paper in half to form a right angle. Then measure down ten inches on each side and draw across for the base of the triangle and cut, allowing for seams. Remember these patterns do not allow for seams. Trace them on cardboard, then cut out the cardboard patterns. Place the cardboard patterns on the material, draw around them with a pencil and then cut outside the pencil line to allow for a seam, but sew on the pencil line. Piece the red and brown triangles together, following the pattern at the

upper left. It sets together always with alternating squares on the diagonal. The unbleached material fills in the four sides as shown.

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
